

# Caswell County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Request for Proposals

The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2017-2018 beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2017**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

**The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:**

Mentoring, Community Service/Restitution	Respite Care (delivered Locally)
Parent Skill-building w/ experiential component	Emergency Shelter Care
Teen Court	Non-traditional experiential recreation
Community Service/Restitution	Gang Prevention/Intervention Programming
Home-based Counseling	Family Counseling/Multi-Systemic Therapy
Interpersonal Skill Building	

Of 35 youth coming to the attention of Caswell County Juvenile Services, 88% are having regular associations with delinquent peers; Eighty-five percent (85%) had moderate to serious school behavior problems; Forty-four (44%) of youth are abusing substances. Risk indicators also suggest that youth who completed juvenile court intake were assessed at a higher percentage than the state average in having prior referrals and having assaultive history.

**Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:**

Peer Domain:	Ninety percent (90%) were either rejected by pro-social peers or reported to be associating with other delinquent peers.
Individual Domain:	Indicators suggest that youth are abusing substances and are in need of assessment or treatment services. Indicators also suggest that 64% of youth are experiencing domestic discord in the home and 30% of youth are victims of abuse. 61% of youth assessed indicated the need for more Mental Health assessment.
Family Domain:	Indicators suggest that there is alcohol or drug use in the family and 62% of youth have family members with criminal histories or family members actively under court supervision or involved with gangs.
School Domain:	Indicators suggest that youth are having difficulty in the school setting as evidenced by truant behaviors or multiple suspensions from school. Eighty-two (82%) of the youth were reported to have moderate to serious problems in school and Thirty-six (36%) percent of youth are functioning below grade level.

**Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:**

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
