No, it's not because we sit and read books all day, because we don't. . . The reason I love being a librarian is because we have a special place in the community. We have the unique opportunity to share life's triumphs and challenges with everyone in the community throughout their lives. We get to watch children grow from babies, learn to read, and wave to us as they get ready to go off to school. They are excited about being a "big kid" and tell us what they're learning. We get to spend summers with them, with programs, crafts, and songs. Then they visit us after school for homework assignments, crafts, and stories. They go to middle school and begin reading chapter books and learning to use the computers. With the library being within walking distance of the High School, many teenagers visit the library after school, join in teen programs, hangout in the stacks holding hands, use the computers and get a little loud playing games



on the Wii. They don't wave at us any more, or share what they are learning in school – at least not in front of their friends. Then we help them find college applications, write letters of reference, and talk about what they want to do after college. We offer free internet access and help people complete an online job application. We have numerous people who can't get or can't afford internet access at home, come to the library to take online classes, email family and friends

who don't live in the area, or compile resumes and cover letters, which can't be done on most smartphones. We offer computer classes, which are often taken by people who have been laid off and need to know some basics about computers. We serve as a bridge to the local Community College for adults that want to go back to school, learn more advanced computer skills, or just learn to read. We are bridges to other county services. We deliver books once a month to

local nursing homes and community centers for people that can't make it into the library. We use books and the online resources to help people research issues or concerns; trying to make people understand that just because it's on the internet, doesn't necessarily make it true. We watch as people go through life changes, providing materials on pet care, new home trends, pregnancy, health concerns, marriage, divorce, and the grief of losing a loved

one. We help people find the next book that they want to read. We watch them go from checking-out cartoons to providing movies for adults who may not have cable. We provide Large Print books and audio books for people with failing eyesight. We become part of people's lives no matter what age, race, religion, or social / economic status. We don't claim to know all of the answers, we only promise to work with you to help you find them.

Caswell County Teen Court Participates in State Teen Court Summit:

Caswell County Teen Court attended the 16th Annual North Carolina Teen Court Association Mock Trial Summit on April 11th – 13th, 2014 in Raleigh N.C. In an effort to strengthen Teen Court performances across the state, county Teen Courts attended. Each of the counties was given a mock trial scenario. Caswell County competed against 15 other counties from North Carolina. Prosecuting Attorney Casey Blackman (daughter of Stacy and Tiny Blackman) received Best Courtroom Attorney for our mock trial. Other students that represented Caswell County Teen Court were; Prosecuting Attorney Tamara Durden (Tony & April Durden), Clerk of Court Chelsea Talbott (Jack & Lisa Talbott), Defense Attorney Kelsey Simpson (Thomas & Lynn

Simpson), Defense Attorney Romi Asad (Fairouz & Faye Asad), Bailiff Phillip Hamlett (Sam & Bethany Hamlett), Defendant Jordan Morris (Sandra Sisk) and alternates Tamiaya Henderson (Tiffany Henderson) and Jared Turner (Tonya Pegg & Jamie Turner).

Teen Court is a program sponsored by the Caswell County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council and the Caswell County Parks & Recreation Youth Outreach /Enrichment Program. Teen Court is for juveniles between 11 and 17 years old that are first offenders charged with a misdemeanor who is actively enrolled in school and admits their guilt. Referrals for Teen Court come from School Resource Officers, Juvenile Court Counselors and Law Enforcement. The courtroom is set as normal with youth volunteers from middle school, high school and home school students who serve as jurors, lawyers, bailiffs

and clerks. Other Caswell County Teen Court Volunteers are Ethan Griffin, Kaytlynn Walton, and Cara White from Dillard Middle School, Ariana Graves from Bartlett Yancey High School, and Sierra and Briana Peterson are home-schooled whom serve as jurors. The Jurors impose mandatory sentencing which includes community service, jury duty, follow school rules & policies and maintain satisfactory grades. Optional sentencing can include an apology letter, a Life Essay about ‘Where Will I Be In Ten Years?’ or ‘What I Have Learned From My Offense and the Negative Outcomes to Myself, Family Community’ or the ‘That’s Life, Why Try’ Life Skills Class.
